Sussex County First Assistant Prosecutors - Good men :)

Bill Fitzgibbons, First Assistant Prosecutor retires and is replaced by Assistant Prosecutor Gregory Mueller on Sep 1, 2009. Bill Fitzgibbons was a good man and recused himself as did another detective when I met them in the Sussex County Grand Jury room recused themselves from any investigation or actions concerning me. Congrats to the excellent new First Assistant Prosecutor Gregg Mueller an outstanding State official as he immediately took action to prevent further hardships to my family as he immediately replaced the Assistant Prosecutor Joseph Corazza, and filed motions to expunge my bail on thirteen fourth degree criminal charges and a petty disorder charge under Ind 08-09-00316-I and also filed a motion to dismiss the indictment which was granted by Superior Court Judge N. Peter Conforti, J.S.C. In addition, as Judge Conforti, JSC was the Superior Court Judge on my municipal appeals of Judge Dana's illegal sentence, resentencing and another resentencing which denied all my civil rights, Judge Conforti ordered the return of the fines, and my attorney Robert Mattia, Esq. who filed many motions in the corrupt Joint Municipal Court of Green, Fredon, Hampton and Borough of Andover with its corrupt Hollander, Strelziek, Pascualli, Hinkes, Vandenberg and Hontz, LLC, 40 Park Place, Newton, N.J. 07860 law firm which is protected by the District X Ethics Committee. Judge Conforti, JSC conducted an extensive, intense finding against Judge Dana's court orders finding his sentencing repeatedly violated court rules and procedures with great emotion. Per Judge Dana court orders, I can not even pay the Borough of Stanhope fee to have a construction code official examine my home as required by the law to obtain a continuing certificate of occupancy, write the Borough of Stanhope for any reason or contact any former or current employee in any manner. Both State appointed doctors concluded I was NOT a threat to myself, any person or private property which was the same conclusion of other doctors I had hired on my own behalf to challenge the false statements made by many Borough of Stanhope officials in the Township of Green's court. Judge Dana even refused to allow me to see the defendant's disclosure requests he admitted on the record he did NOT even read nor allow any to be entered into the court record and did NOT allow witness in my defense which I requested in his kanagroo court and engaged in willful criminal violation of my civil rights normally a second degree crime N.J.S.A.2C:30-6(a) but since I suffered bodily harm the crime can be raised to the first degree. As this was done 13 times for each verdict is separate and then twice more, I believe that 39 separate crimes of that statute were committed by Judge Dana, J.M.C. and those that confederated and conspired with him which include Stanhope Bor-

ough Attorney Richard Stein, Mayor Diana Kuncken Governing Body members Mike Depew and George Graham and others as Ms. Robin Kline who was under the Federal Whistle Blower Program in Chicago, Il was under great mental duress as indicated by her shaking uncontrollably on the stand do her obvious prior mental injuries on a sustained repeated basis by dozens of felons noted on the web site FreedomNewsDigest.com or ThomasCaggiano.com

County legal expert retires

Bill Fitzgibbons retired from public service this week after serving five years as Sussex County first assistant prosecutor and providing decades of legal counsel to the county and its municipalities during his private practice.

Prosecutor David Weaver appointed Fitzgibbons, 63, as his first assistant in May 2004 based on his breadth of experience.

Fitzgibbons served as an attorney for the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority for 15 years and as Vernon Township's municipal prosecutor for 12 years, among other public work, the prosecutor said.

"Bill Fitzgibbons was an asset to this office and will be missed, both professionally and personally," Weaver said.

Fitzgibbons was admitted to the bar in 1972 and maintained a private practice in Franklin for 30 years before his appointment to the prosecutor's office.

Assistant Prosecutor Gregory Mueller was sworn in Tuesday as Fitzgibbons' replacement.

Fitzgibbons said he retired for health-related reasons. He had taken leave from the office for about a year before returning to work in November.

He said he was proud of the spirit of cooperation between the detectives and assistant prosecutors in the office, and the progress of the Cold Case Unit established during Weaver's first term.

"I thought it was very interesting, very productive," he said of his tenure. "Everybody there tried their best to do a good job."

Fitzgibbons lives in Ogdensburg with his wife, Peg, and has two daughters, Anna, of Burlington, Vt., and JoEllen, of Venice, Calif.

The first assistant prosecutor is responsible for the implementation of the prosecutor's policies and oversight of the assistant prosecutors and detectives, according to Weaver.

"The first assistant makes sure they're doing what they're supposed to be doing in their assigned areas of responsibility," Weaver said.

Fitzgibbons' replacement, Mueller, 43, worked as a senior auditor at accounting firm KPMG in Short Hills before graduating in the top 10 of his class at the Duquesne University School of Law in 1995.

He worked for the Morris County Prosecutor's Office and in private practice with Mueller, Russo and Warmington before joining the Sussex County office in 2005.

In early 2008, Mueller and Assistant Prosecutor Francis Koch secured a guilty verdict in the murder trial of Wayne resident Paul Foglia, who had killed his girlfriend's mother in Wantage. Foglia received a life sentence. Weaver said he tapped Mueller for the first assistant position because of his proven track record, his demonstrated writing ability and his familiarity with white-collar crime from his time as an accountant.

"He's is always willing and eager to accept new challenges, and he's got the respect of his colleagues and peers," Weaver said. Mueller lives in Hardyston and has two children.


